From June 13-19, Hudson United Methodist Church will be sending 2 teams of up to 7 people per team to serve in rural regions of Kentucky to spread the love of Jesus and to help make homes warmer, safer, and drier for those in need. This year will be our 47th year of volunteering at ASP.

The cost to send two teams for the week is slightly over \$7,800, which includes:

- team travel and living expenses
- materials for repairing homes
- tools and supplies used by our teams
- the cost of ASP staff to help setup and oversee repairs
- background checks for adults attending the trip

Normally this time of year, we raise money for our annual trip via a benefit dinner with a silent/live auction. While we are unable to have the auction due to COVID-19 restrictions, we could still use your help in providing financial and...

Other (Joy): Give as your heart calls on you to give.








Hudson UMC helps support the Hudson Food Pantry. We committed to supplying paper towels each month for the 35+ families utilizing the pantry in 2021.

Suppose you have not been worthy of trust in handling worldly wealth. Then who will trust you with true riches? - Luke 16:11 (NIRV).


Stewardship at its core is the responsible management of something that is entrusted to your care. The Finance Committee and the various Committee Chairs at Hudson UMC work very hard to effectively manage your pledges and gifts in ways that maximize the amount of money that goes to supporting the ministries of the church. This aligns very well with the verse from Luke 16 above. By continuing to demonstrate good stewardship of the gifts that God has entrusted to us, God will entrust us with more important goals such as leading others to Jesus Christ and creating future disciples.

Our stewardship of pledges and gifts often includes finding innovative ways to reduce costs and to control expected increases in cost. Efforts currently underway include:

- examining utility providers and pricing for the church and the parsonage
- making adjustments to our lawn maintenance and snow plowing contracts for flexibility
- reducing the amount of lawn care spend through volunteer work days
- utilizing the Church Caretaker to clear sidewalks (saving \$900)
- making changes to reduce future heating and cooling costs (hopefully saving \$1,700/year)
- instituting a vendor managed inventory program for purchasing cleaning products and supplies
- ensuring a competitive bidding process for necessary work

These proactive steps will hopefully allow us to expand our ministries and outreach into the community. Thank you for your ongoing support of HUMC ministries through your prayers, presence, gifts, and service.

Confirmation Classes


