


"It's not fair!" How often do we hear these words?

A wealthy landowner needs workers for his vineyard. So he goes out throughout the day and employs people in need of work. In fact, in one instance he even asks, "Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?" They answer, "Because no one has hired us." The vineyard owner employs them as well. Everything seems to be okay until the end of the day. When the day's work is done, regardless of when the workers have entered the vineyard, he pays them the exact same wage. And that would be bad enough, but he pays the last to come in first, and the first to come in last. Can you imagine that? The ones who came on the job at 5:00, just an hour or two before sundown, got the same pay as those who had worked from the early sunrise. You can only imagine the grumbling by those early ones as they stood at the back of the line...and rightly so, wouldn't you say?

Ah, but this story challenges our feelings by suggesting to us that what we would term as fair is not what is important. It is what helps that makes the difference. It is what helps that is important. Jesus told this story about a wealthy man. He had the power to do anything he wanted. He could help; but the people grumbled at the way in which he helped.

We, who tend to grumble, must begin to realize that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is about grace, not morality, not decency, not being watchdogs of the public welfare. The Gospel doesn't have to do with our goodness except as some kind of by-product, and it really doesn't have anything to do with our trying to become salty and radiant persons ON OUR OWN. It is about the business of so steeping ourselves in the goodness and grace of the Lord, that the beauty of His spirit and the brightness of His light reflects in our lives. It is extra. It is the way God deals with us beyond what we deserve or feel that we have earned. For in spite of our grumbling...it is not what is fair that makes the difference...it is what helps.

Church Council Highlights of Tuesday, June 22 Meeting

- Council adopted new policy for reopening the HUMC building:
 - If you are vaccinated, you will not be required to wear a mask or socially distance, but all should be respectful of others and their potential vulnerability. Within the church building if you are not fully vaccinated, please wear a mask and socially distance.
 - Worship will be celebrated in our sanctuary beginning no later than Sunday, August 1 with improvements underway with new equipment and technology. The improvements will continue to allow us to share our weekly worship online: Facebook, YouTube, HUMC website.
 - Our past guidelines were put in place to best protect all members of our church family and others in the community taking part in our many ministries.
 - We would like small groups to discuss preferences of those in attendance with respect to masking and distancing within their circles.
- To reduce traffic cutting through our parking lot the Trustees will begin to chain
 off the Aurora entrance during weekdays with a movable pylon for better safety
 and reduce accidents.
- New carpet will soon be installed in the sanctuary.
- The General Fund balance as of May 31 is a bit lower at \$65,950 and the Care and Repair Fund has a balance of \$45,918. 2020 Conference and District Apportionments have been paid off and we are looking to pay off our 2021 Apportionments by the end of this year.
- Nursery School is seeking new Board members.
- Referrals of candidates are needed to fill both the custodian position and Director of Music.
- Paul Brown has filled the team of 8 for the November Puerto Rico Mission trip.
- The Vacation Bible School theme is Concrete and Cranes and they are recruiting volunteers for the evenings of August 5, 12 & 19. Yard signs to promote sign-ups are available. The Safe Sanctuary team is updating polices and almost everyone at HUMC will need recertification since done in 2017.
- Debbie King is now chair of Memorial, Endowments and Gifts Committee. As of the end of April the MEG Fund Balance was \$94,254. The remaining money in the Meditation Garden Fund is being transferred to Care and Repair, \$466. The Kitchen Fund is being combined with the Reception Fund adding \$90.
- The UMW Gifts from the Heart campaign raised \$885 for Heart 4 the City, and Center of Hope.

Financial Corner by Bill Centrello - Finance Committee Chair




It's hard to believe, but summer is certainly moving fast. I wanted to take a moment to provide the congregation with an update on HUMC's financial position now that we are halfway through the year. Looking at the first half of the year, there are many things to be thankful for, including (but not limited to):

- Continuing outdoor Worship and expanding our reach online and via
- Hudson Community Television
- Safely maintaining various ministries that we support in the Church such as
- Nursery School, and Scouting
- Safely supporting other ministries including traveling to Kentucky for
- Appalachian Service Project
- Paying off outstanding 2020 Apportionments, thereby supporting worldwide UMC ministries
- Returning to indoor Worship and having the pleasure of welcoming old friends and
- new into our Sanctuary
- Maintaining small group relationships through Zoom and other technologies

Financially, we ended the first six months of the year with both giving and expenses being less than anticipated. Overall, this has resulted in an overall General Fund deficit of \$28,000 as of June 30th. As a congregation, we are also \$11,000 behind on our payment of 2021 Apportionments. Our Care & Repair Fund balance is just over \$47,000, which will provide support for upcoming repairs for parking lot sealing and striping work as well as some contingency for future planned and unplanned repairs.

I am hoping that the second half of 2021 brings a renewed energy to the entire church via our prayers, presence, support for our church family, sharing of spiritual gifts and financial giving in a spirit of gratitude for how God is actively working in our lives.
