Kids Capes of Courage:

The Hudson United Methodist Women are preparing for our third year of service to a project called *Kids Capes of Courage*. This organization was founded by several women from Northampton United Methodist Church in Cuyahoga Falls to



provide capes for children who are in hospitals in need of extra love and comfort. The children surround themselves with the capes and feel empowered to combat their illness. *HUMW supports this project by purchasing appropriate fabric, using patterns to cut the fabric, and then sewing the fabric into capes. We would love to have you join us. Some people lay the pattern on the fabric, cut, and prepare the kits. Some people who have sewing skills sew the kits to make the cape.* Then the finished capes are delivered to Debby Rowland, our contact person at Kids Capes of Courage. Debby in turn delivers the capes to Akron Children's Hospitals and other hospitals for distribution to the children. During the past two years, we have made approximately 36 capes each year.
