

This month also holds our celebration of All Saints Day. It is a day when we remember those who have been close to us in our life's journey. We remember that they have moved on to be fully in the presence of God. Whatever that means to us, it pains us to be left behind. Yet we are reminded that our own lives cycle on, just as the leaves fall to the ground to be covered by the cold and snow of winter. All of this is beautiful in its own way. I believe the time to think about it comes in Sabbath. So please, keep your Sabbath time.

I have learned the hard way recently that time is all too precious. There is no reclaiming it. It is expended, whether we take the time to realize it or not. I pray you find Sabbath time. I pray that you are aware of your surroundings. I pray you take the time to observe the beauty present around you each and every day. I just pray for

you. Please pray for me.




