

Trustee Ministry

There have been a number of repairs and preventative maintenance tasks completed within the church over the last several months. Here is a list of just a few items, in case you may have missed them:

*Early in summer the prayer box was repaired and re-varnished and brought back to proper working condition again, and looked good with the new-season flowers that were planted.

*The tall, white shutters attached to the building's exterior walls were removed to clear a family of bats and carpenter bees living from behind them. They were re-painted with insect repellant paint, and re-hung. And, within this same vicinity of the church, repairs were made to the roof and overhang that extends over the playground facility.

The largest project was the re-sealing and re-lining of the parking lot which took place over a two-day period near the end of August. Thanks and appreciation is extended to all those who made alternative plans in visiting the church during that time.

*The two exterior pole lights which illuminate our pathway to the sanctuary's main doors have been repaired so that they work at night, which is an improvement to what we have been experiencing previously.

*The exterior of the parsonage has been given a spruce up as well, with repairs being made to the window frames before a whole exterior power wash, and a fresh coat of paint around the affected windows and front doorway.

*This summer has also seen extensive work by the Akron City Water Department as they replaced the water mains on the north boundary of the church and parsonage.


*Turning our attention inside, a number of electrical, fluorescent lighting, fixtures have either been repaired or replaced within the church. We have also contracted the HVAC services of a local company to assist in maintaining our furnace and air conditioning units. We have 12 of them! These bi-annual inspections not only help us make the necessary repairs required in a timely fashion but also provides us with valuable preventative maintenance that ultimately saves the church money in costly repairs.

*Within the sanctuary itself, half of the fans have been taken down and have had their motors repaired ensuring a longer lifespan. Now, with only a wiring adjustment at the switch plate left to do, all six fans should be operational.

*In a final tick of our current checklist, the elevator is back in compliance with the State of Ohio and is operational.

*Here are two ways you can assist us with the care and upkeep of our church:

- 1) Come volunteer with our Fall Clean-Up Day next month
- 2) Consider helping us with our search for a volunteer to remove snow from our walkway on Sunday mornings.
