Psalm 137:1-4

Replacing the carefree casualness of summer is a businesslike, closely scheduled, hectic pace of autumn. Some things just happen, and we all know it is time to get back to work. As we become busier, it is easier to fall into line with what our culture expects of us. Maybe we have spent far too much time worrying about who will hear us, rather than thinking about the importance of the gathering and the singing and the doing. I hope you choose to commit to joining us in worship and in church school. We really do need your voice. No one else can sing your part.
