"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?..." Isaiah 43:19



The Christian Unity Prayer Service is an ecumenical celebration of the Word of God scheduled in conjunction with the International Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. Hudson clergy will lead the congregation in prayer and praise in accordance with this year's theme, "We saw his star in the East, and we came to worship him" (Matthew 2:2) Rev. Lawrence Jurcak, St. Mary Parish, Hudson, will give the sermon.

Our featured speaker after the luncheon is Rev. Nayiri Karjian, from Living Water Association.
