

NURSERY SCHOOL





The United Women in Faith (UWF) is very happy to announce that our fall mission project of preparing hygiene kits for UMCOR is off to a wonderful beginning! We are inviting you to participate by taking a leaf or two from the tree in the Sunday school wing, shopping for the items on that leaf, and returning them under the tree. We began collecting items on October 10 and October 16 and after only two Sundays of your donations, we have collected the following: 32 hand towels, 62 washcloths, 42 toothbrushes, 44 bars of soap, 32 nail clippers, 46 one-gallon resealable bags, 120 bandages (10 bandages are required for each kit), 13 combs and monetary donations.

Your participation is so appreciated and will help many people who have been devastated by floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, and other natural disasters. As usual, this congregation is so generous.
