

Thoughts Along the Way...

The time "before Christmas" is a season on the Christian calendar called Advent - the beginning of the Christian Year. Our culture will count the "shopping days" before Christmas (which seems to begin in September...or earlier). Advent is a time of preparation in the Church. One lesson Advent teaches is that waiting is a healthy discipline. (*If you want to know more about "Advent" go to UMC.org*)

I recall being told when packages began to appear under a tree in our home, "**Do not open before Christmas!**" I recall telling our daughters, "**Do not open before Christmas!**" I now hear our granddaughters being told, "**Do not open before Christmas!**" Have you heard this command? Have you shared this command? It is hard to follow those instructions.

This year during Advent, I challenge you to disobey what you have been told. I propose that to celebrate Christmas (the event as designed by God) we should **open some things before Christmas...and keep opening all year 'round:**


Sunday, November 27 "Before Christmas - Open Your Ears" Isaiah 55:3

Sunday, December 18 "Before Christmas - Open Your Mouth" Psalm 51:15



Special recognition was given to Amy Lunn and Sandy Wristen who brought the first Thanksgiving


