Worship is central to what we Christians do and to who we are, and it can be especially meaningful to share it with a child. It can also be especially difficult. Two of my children (I won't say who) were not allowed to sit next to each other in worship because inevitably, they would share a joke and begin laughing at the most inopportune moments. I admit there were times when I worried about what others were thinking about the Sunday school teacher and her distracted kids. The truth was, I wanted the service to have meaning for them, as it did for me, but sometimes it was just one long hour for all of us.

In solidarity with any parents who might be feeling a similar angst in response to their children's recently extended time in worship, I've created some resources to help parents and children cross the great divide from "Be quiet and good" to "Be still and know that I am God."

When you come to worship with your children or grandchildren, please take and use one of our new *Children's Bulletins*. It was created to help children of all ages engage more fully in the experience of worship. The order of worship is the same as in the adult bulletins, but with a more kid-friendly look and with accompanying explanations for why we do what we do.

As you worship together, encourage your children to notice their surroundings and actively take part in the service. Have them use the accompanying *Bookmarks* to mark the upcoming hymns in their hymnals, and when it's time to sing, help them follow the words. Invite your young child to draw a picture on their *My Offering* card of a loving act over the past week that they can dedicate to God.

Show your children the readings of the Call to Worship and the Invocation in your bulletin or on the screens, even if they don't read or understand the words yet. They'll understand the spirit behind them. Help guide your children by pointing out the different sections in the bulletin to them, explaining how they represent the

Christian response to God: We gather, we sing, we pray, we listen for God's Word, we give, we praise, and we serve. During the sermon, your older children may use the insert as an aid in actively listening. Afterwards, talk to them about the words they did not know, and share your own thoughts on the message. If your children take part in the Children's Sermon time, ask them what they did or talked about. Relate memorable ideas from the adult's message.

Your children are already learning to love a God who cares of them, gives them strength, and guides them. In response to these blessings, and with your nurture, guidance, and example, they can also learn to worship this God in a way that is meaningful and significant...and only funny when it's supposed to be.

Church Council Meeting Highlights of January 17, 2023: Tom King offered devotion with opening prayer and minutes of September 27 Council meeting approved.

<u>Planning for the Next Big Thing:</u> A meeting was held to debrief the Key of Hope concert and plan a similar event in the future - the "Next Big Thing". It was suggested for the next time we host an event that we create a concert program that includes information about HUMC and also an invitation to upcoming HUMC events. Ideas for the Next Big Thing included: a Jazz Night concert; presence at the Community Days Farmers Market (June 17), also the Ice Cream Social (June 16); hosting a Bike Rodeo in conjunction with our Scout troops; and again hosting Trunk or Treat. Elizabeth Goodin advised to use our energy to advance a strategic goal and Sherry Newill advised to keep in mind that our resources (organizers and volunteers) are limited which could affect the quality of our results. Bruce suggested we make T-shirts that show we are Hudson UMC to show our presence to the community. Another idea put forth was to have a float in the Memorial Day parade; Chris offered use of his flatbed trailer; and it was suggested it could feature our church musicians.



Finance Report and adoption of 2023 Budget:

The proposed budget for 2023 forecasts pledges of \$280,000 and projected income from the parsonage rental. While projecting lower expenses due to apportionments, and showing a 3% staff increase on July 1st, the budget remains with a \$29,900 deficit. We have relied on interfund borrowing to carry these deficits. The 2023 General Fund budget is one of faith and was approved unanimously.

Ministry Reports:

- Committee on Education and Family Ministries - Review is underway of a new children's Sunday school curriculum for Preschool-Grade 1 and Grades 2-5 and curriculum for Grades 6-12 class. Teachers to lead that age group are needed. The new plan for the children to remain in worship is underway with the youngest children (up to Gr. 2) are invited to move to the CAC during the sermon for a short kid-oriented lesson on the same message. We are equipping parents to serve as their children's worship mentors with new children's bulletins and a new booklet *Worshiping Together; A Guide for Families.* For adult ministries we have a new subscription to *Amplify Media*, a study resource by the EOC, replacing its "Media Center".

Missions - Alternative Giving raised \$1,945 in donations to local, national, and international missions. The ASP mission trip is June 11 - 17, our 49th year. Local missions support continues for Open M, Feed My Sheep, and Hudson Food Pantry. Communications - Bill said more help is needed with AV of worship services. UMW - A name change to United Women of Faith is underway. Capes for Courage is a sewing project for Children's Hospital. Soon to start is collection for Gifts from the Heart.

Rev. Hartley - Former pastor Don Kline has moved back to the area.

Trustees -The furnace blower in the Fellowship Hall has failed, replacement would be\$30,000, but a fix for \$3000 will be made. Patching and sealing drives will likely be deferred to 2024. Please inform the office of all church events so that the snow clearing can be scheduled for their safety.

Membership Secretary - Debbie is working with Sheryl Reynolds to generate a more accurate member list. Elizabeth Goodin is asking all small groups to record names of attendance so the church can monitor people's connections.
