

As Lent begins, I am compelled to call the people of Hudson United Methodist Church to 40 days of prayer. Our focused prayer will call upon God to bring clarity to the collective heart of Hudson UMC regarding nurturing the faith of all generations who currently or will in the future gather with Hudson UMC.

Clearly God brought about new life through a time of searching and listening. God will not disappoint as God's people called Hudson UMC to give ourselves to pray for clarity.



Using God's Gifts to Do God's Work

I have no sense of direction. At shopping malls, I often turn the wrong way when leaving a store. I don't realize it until things begin to look too familiar, as if I had passed them just a few minutes earlier, and in fact, I have. The ability to orient myself is not one of my strengths, so I rely on others. It saves time.

Maybe God arranged it that way so that I would never walk through life alone.

In 1 Corinthians, Paul spoke of strengths, or gifts, as manifestations of the Spirit given for the common good. We are a body collectively, not individually. We need each other to accomplish what God has in mind for us.

Our work as a church has grown into many tasks, each requiring different talents and gifts. How successful would our ministry be—what potential could be reached—if those tasks were accomplished by individuals performing in their own unique areas of strength? Isn't this how God intended the body of Christ to work?

A few weeks ago, I spoke to a group of women about how we might discover our own unique gifts, strengths, and personality traits that direct us toward a particular way of being in the world. With this knowledge in hand, we may then lean toward certain types of ministries or tasks within a ministry that brings out our best, that energizes us, and that brings us joy.

Business author Marcus Buckingham describes how people may know when they are manifesting their strengths in a task: not only are they good at that task, but they instinctively look forward to doing it. It feels easy, and though they may be tired afterward, they feel full rather than empty. There is a sense of fulfillment because they have enabled God to work through them, using the gifts God gave them.

Is it possible that God has brought us together as a community of faith with our unique combination of gifts and talents *for such a time as this* (Esther 4:14) to accomplish God's shared mission for us in a way that only we, working together in harmony, can?

I encourage everyone: Search heart and mind to find a way, here at this church, to express who you are and what you love. Are you an organizer of data, things, or people? We need your gift. Are you good at visualizing the big picture? Tell us what you see. Does it bring you joy to create something from nothing? That something could be the answer we've been searching for. Trust that this comes from God and that you are meant to use it in this body. Seek out your way to contribute. Because, I feel certain that this is what will help to bring Hudson United Methodist Church closer to what God is calling **us** to be right now.


