

Thoughts Along the Way...

"Now – on your way. Tell his disciples and Peter that he is going on ahead..." Mark 16:7 MSG

Picture and reflect on the following people:

- Three people in your life whom you most like.
- Two people who've had the most positive influence on you.
- A person who inspires you to do your best.

As you picture the faces of those you have mentally noted above, consider WHY they stand out in your life. There is a theory as to why the people you picture and reflect upon come to mind, you feel seen by them. Something about the way they see and engage with you makes you feel like you matter. The thought is you feel this way with them because, to them, you do matter. A book I am reading calls what I just described, *outward mindset*.

Consider this: the difference between a self-focused inward mindset and an others-focused outward mindset.

Those who gathered at the empty tomb were admittedly self-focused, grief will do that – turn our attention upon ourselves. It was while in the presence of the Holy the grief-stricken followers were startled by "a young man" who instructed the women to go and tell the others that "he" (Jesus) is going on ahead."

The Easter story transforms Jesus' Followers from self-focused to others-focused, from inward to outward. Throughout Jesus' earthly ministry, he gave witness to "others-focused/outward mindset."

Easter People, the Church, are challenged to be like Christ... "others-focused/outward mindset."

I propose a healthy question to pose is the very same question once posed to Jesus, "who is my neighbor?" To love our neighbor, we need to know our neighbor.

How will this benefit?

- It will enable us to be Christ-like thus others-focused.
- It can assist us to consider what our neighbors' needs and challenges are.
- We can begin to pray and plan to address their needs and challenges.

I am praying this, "What would change in a five-mile radius of the church if those in this area were to experience a community of faith that made them feel like they mattered, to God and to God's people?"

I invite you to join me in praying this question. I hope we can discuss God's answer.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL?

Did you know that children's Sunday school is a relatively recent invention? It began in the 19th century as general education, with **some** religious training. Since then, Sunday school has evolved from education to faith formation and cycled through many movements, styles, and approaches. At Hudson United Methodist Church, we're settling into our own unique program of active learning that is shaping our children, nurturing relationships, and most importantly helping our children to know and worship a loving God.

I want you to know that there is intention and purpose behind everything we do for our children on Sunday mornings, from the stories we tell to the variety of activities we do. Even the arrangement of our seating and the snacks we eat together are chosen with deliberateness and intention. We use the human experiences of community, storytelling, and exploration to bring understanding to the truths of Heaven. Here is a small sampling of recent ways we have done this.

On the day when Rev. Bruce gave everyone red hearts, we talked during the children's sermon time about nurturing the seeds of love that God has planted in our hearts. The kids then made their own hearts from modeling clay, potting soil, and wildflower seeds, with instructions to plant them in the ground to be watered by the melting snow, until springtime flowers bloom. I can't guarantee wildflowers, but the seeds of that lesson did take hold.

A few weeks ago, the Sunday school classes combined for a lesson about Peter walking on water. The kids were invited to



put their hands in actual water to test how it would feel if their fingers tried to walk on water. They were asked, "What would happen if those were your feet trying to walk on water?" and "Do you think Peter should have stayed in or gotten out of the boat?"



For their Easter lesson, the Preschool through Grade One class made a painting of sunrise colors covering over a small paper cross. Peeling away the cross after they were finished then revealed a surprise. The cross that told a sad story the week before, reappeared surrounded by sunlight and the hope of a new day. Later, the class prayed together, "Help us to remember that Jesus' death was not the end; it was a new beginning for all of us!"

What these accounts don't capture is the part where God takes over. There is a safe space throughout all we do within which God acts, where connections and lasting impressions are made and where relationships are nurtured. Amidst the art projects, the

games and all the other activities, is the Spirit hovering... accomplishing more than we could ever do in 45 minutes.
