STICKY FAITH



"Sticky faith" is a term I have become accustomed to using when talking about goals for impacting the faith lives of children and youth. We want our young people to leave the time under our influence with a faith that holds fast and that continues to grow and mature along with them. It is also important that they experience a sticky community

within God's family because research has shown that those who have felt valued and loved in a community of faith will seek to find it again, wherever life takes them. I want 2023 and the years that follow to be significantly "sticky" for our kids.

Part of our strategy toward this end is to provide faith formation experiences targeted purposefully to the specific needs of the young. You read last month about some of the ways this is happening for our preschool and elementary children. On April 30th, a group of committed leaders, parents, and youth will meet to envision together how the most creative and impactful ministry to middle and high school youth might actively play out here at Hudson UMC. There is so much possibility in this arena.

The other necessary piece of this puzzle is to be mindful that the faith community in which our kids are learning, growing, and practicing their faith is not limited exclusively to their own age and stage. They need a comfort zone they will not grow out of, but rather progressively grow into. How might this look?

It looks like kids moving from being mentored in worship by their parents to reading Scripture as worship liturgists...from playing games about sowing seeds of faith to sharing a new perspective on the story alongside adult learners...from visiting Laurel Lake to give away a cross they made to conceiving of their own ministry that depends on using their unique giftedness...from taking part in children's choir to lending their voices to the multi-generational Daughters of Faith Chorus.

These seeds have already been planted, and there will be more to come.

As their church family at this moment in time, we are tasked with helping our kids' faith to grow and to become sticky. We can do this as the leaders and teachers who

tell them the story and also as the fellow seekers and servants building relationships, exchanging wisdom, worshiping, and serving faithfully alongside them. My own vision is of a church that flows organically and dynamically between the two. How do you see it? As Rev. Bruce says, "Let's talk."




NURSERY SCHOOL

Opening Prayer and Devotion: By Tom King Approval of minutes: The January 17, 2023, Council meeting minutes were approved. Planning for the Next Big Thing: Tom reviewed the Next Big Thing group - what they are planning to carry on the spirit and promise of the Key of Hope concert with its appeal and faith message for the congregation and community members: A "Tool Box" of pointers and resources to help those organizing events. 

HUMC Financial Update

As we head into Spring, the Finance Committee wanted to provide an update on Church finances.

The data shown below covers the time period from January 1, 2023 - March 31, 2023. About 40% of our pledged giving for the year has already been received. Thanks to your generosity, and the fact that first-quarter church ministry expenses are running \$3,200 less than expected, the fund that supports the general ministries of the Church now has a positive balance of \$22,247. Our Church Care & Repair Fund has a positive balance of \$27,306. Please keep in mind that your ongoing support of Church ministries is essential, as we are still projecting a \$30,000 deficit by year-end based on current pledged giving and other anticipated income.

Our annual audit of church deposits, expenses, bank statements, and Foundation funds was conducted on February 18th. Records were found to be meticulously kept and financial controls were working as designed. Subsequently, an audit of United Women in Faith records yielded similar results. Thanks to everyone who assisted with these audits that ensure that we are being good stewards of the resources God has entrusted to us.
