

I migrated to the concept of fear being dispelled when we pause to understand. I found this concept while reading this book:

I Never Thought of It That Way: How to Have Fearlessly Courageous Conversations In Dangerously Divided Times by Mónica Guzmán

Here is a brief description of this book

"We think we have the answers, but we need to be asking a lot more questions.

Journalist Mónica Guzmán is the loving liberal daughter of Mexican immigrants who voted twice—for Donald Trump. When the country could no longer see straight across the political divide, Mónica set out to find what was blinding us and discovered the most eye-opening tool we're *not* using: our own built-in curiosity."

Well, one thought led to another, and I moved on from the presidential election that stirred her quest to understand her parents and then hundreds of others. The questions she posed were leading me to rethink and even fear less, some I had never taken the time to better understand. Then October 7 rattled the world with an invasion into Israel resulting in killings and hostages taken.

I listened to Palestinians pleading for bombs to stop bombarding their children and homes in Gaza. I heard strong rhetoric from Israel's leaders about annihilating Hamas. I realized how little

I understood about the parties involved in the war. I then recalled Guzman's book. I was stirred to do more than internally reflect but to pursue deeper understanding amid fearful times.

So, beginning January 14, 2024, we will explore some elementary learnings about some World Religions. The series is entitled: What Christians can learn.

Jan. 14 - What Christians can learn from Judaism.

Jan. 21 - What Christians can learn from Muslims.

Jan. 28 - What Christians can learn from Hindus.

Feb. 4 - What Christians can learn from Buddhists.

Feb. 11 - Why I am a Christian.

I hope we can understand more and fear less. I pray we can enter into healthy conversations in these divided times.

HUMC also supplies toilet paper, and a roll is offered every week with 130+ carry-out lunches.



## <u>Bible in a Year</u>

I have a hoarding tendency when it comes to Bibles. I probably own close to 30. Some were gifts from a church. Some are associated with a particular class or event I attended. I do make a point of collecting children's and youth Bibles. And finally, I just love reading all the different translations, sidebars, and study notes. I'm always discovering new insights, interpretations, and ways of using my different Bibles. I find that thrilling – anyone with me??



So... I can't wait to break into my newest Bible, the <u>ESV Journaling Study</u> <u>Bible</u> (number 31?). This one has something my others don't: enough space in the margins to record thoughts, notes, questions, and wonderings. I even got special no-bleed fine line pens made for this purpose! These "conversations" will become a record of where I am at this particular time in my life and faith journey.

I'm sharing all of this **because I would like to invite YOU to embark this year, along with me, on a Bible reading plan with your favorite Bible**. I wanted to try something new, so I did some investigating and found a unique chronological crossreference Bible reading plan from the people at Bible Study Together. Here is an excerpt from their website that describes a little about how this plan works. I'm intrigued!



Bible Study Together's Bible reading plan interweaves the New Testament and Old Testament together in a single tapestry so that Old Testament stories, psalms, and prophecies connect as much as possible to New Testament teaching without losing their original context <u>(Note: It is also Chronological)</u>. So, when you are reading in James about Abraham offering Isaac on the altar, you are also reading this account in Genesis. Likewise, when you are reading about the Day of Atonement in Leviticus, you are also reading in Hebrews about Jesus being the fulfillment of this sacrifice.

There is also an app associated with this plan that contains daily study questions, videos and resources, and that allows a group to interact together as they read. That's the part



that interested me. <u>Here</u> is a link to much more information about this plan and all that it offers.

**I would love to form a Hudson UMC online Bible reading community** this year, to help each other stay on track, share questions and insights, and simply journey together. If that appeals to you as well, let this be your sign to take on this challenge with me and others. In the early mornings, I'll be in my favorite chair with my new Bible, my pen, and a hot cup of coffee. Won't you join me?

**CHRISTIAN UNITY PRAYER SERVICE & LUNCHEON** 

In celebration of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, Hudson churches are planning the annual interdenominational prayer service and luncheon scheduled for Thursday, January 18, 2024, at 10:00 AM. First Congregational Church of Hudson, located at 47 Aurora St., will host the event. The ecumenical prayer service, led by local clergy, will focus on the theme, "You shall love the Lord your God...and your neighbor as yourself" (*Luke 10:27*) Rev Lynn Anderson, Chaplain of Independent Living at Laurel Lake, will give the sermon. The resources for this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by a group of Christians from Burkina Faso, West Africa.

Ticket holders will enjoy a box lunch catered by Nosh, immediately following the service. The box lunch options are
