








<u> Maundy Thursday Worship Bags</u>

APPALACHIA SERVICE PROJECT – 2024

Please support our ministry in rural Appalachia to restore hope and make homes warmer, safer, and drier for people in need.

2024 is Hudson UMC's 50th year of service with ASP. We feel blessed to have maintained this ministry for so long, thanks to the dedicated support of our congregation.

We plan to send 1-2 teams of adults and youth again this year to serve during the week of June 9th – June 15^{th,} 2024. The total cost for the trip is expected to be \$7,000 - \$9,000, which covers transportation, room and board, and building supplies.

Please consider making a financial donation to support our teams this year. Your contribution is tax deductible. You can donate in one of the following ways:

- Using the Realm app, by selecting the fund Missions (Appalachian Service Project)
- In-person during Worship Services offering (put ASP 2024 on the memo line of your envelope/check)
- By placing a check in the Financial Secretary's mailbox in the church office (put ASP 2024 on the memo line of your check)

Here is some insight into the levels of expenses we must cover; however, any gift is greatly appreciated:

- A gift of comfort: \$75 treats the team to well-deserved snacks or ice cream.
- **A gift of hope**: \$100 covers one-way gasoline expenses to Kentucky.
- A gift of warmth: \$250 helps defray participation expenses for a single volunteer.
- A gift of love: \$500 helps defray the cost of team supplies for the week.
- A gift of compassion: \$1,500 pays for the rental cost of one van.







How Will We Make Disciples?

Last month in this space, I shared the mission of Hudson United Methodist Church that was adopted at last October's all-church 3R (Reflect, Realign, Renew) planning/visioning meetings: **To make and mature disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.** We share this statement with The United Methodist Church, and it reflects Jesus' Great Commission to *go and make disciples*... (Matthew 28:18-20).

Each Methodist church will accomplish this mission in ways that reflect its own unique culture and values. So, identifying who we are and what we value here at Hudson UMC is central to discerning how we will make disciples here.


At our initial Reflection evening in October, a group of both long and short-term members and friends shared stories of inspiration and pride regarding their individual experiences with Hudson UMC. Through a group exercise, recurring themes were then distilled down to three core values that define who we are at our strongest and best: **At Hudson UMC, we value growing spiritually, serving others, and nurturing relationships.**

Growing spiritually and serving others are hallmarks of an intentional pathway to discipleship, so discipleship is a mission already at our core. And because it is important to us to cultivate strong and meaningful relationships within our community, we will find it natural and fulfilling to continue to make disciples of one another.

Having identified our core values as a church, our next step is to define the particulars of how we will accomplish our mission to make and mature disciples of Christ both on an individual level and as part of our wider communities. This will be an ongoing process, but at this stage, I can offer a few possibilities.

Because we value growing spiritually, we will continue to encourage participation in Sunday school classes and Bible studies. We will also look for more short-term classes to offer, covering special topics and Faith 101-type subjects.





Because we value serving others, we will continue to encourage faith in action through our many service opportunities and mission partners. We will further offer resources that will guide participants in understanding the unique God-given gifts they possess and how they may offer these gifts in service to their world.

And finally, because we value nurturing relationships, we will continue to encourage participation in small group activities and discussions, and even microgroups of 3 or 4, all of which are designed to be faith-

nurturing and life-affirming and to provide companionship and a soft place to land while navigating life's winding paths together.

I pray that this brief picture continues to grow and develop into something like what Jesus had in mind when he told his disciples to go make more disciples. You pray too, and then together we'll work, plan, and watch expectantly just what God will accomplish in and through our church family.


