The recent sermon series, "Doing What Disciples Do" addressed five areas of intentionality would-be-disciples dedicate themselves to doing – Love, Follow, Worship, Work and Prayer. By no means should these five foci be limited to just these. But these, and more, should be lived out in the spirit of love.

Humanity is created with the desire **to be loved and to love.** Jesus understands that need, thus he reminded his disciples, to "abide in my love." Jesus taught this core belief that love is an **experience** before it is an **expression**. The Church is given the task to **express** love to a world starving for love.

As Hudson UMC realigns all we do with "making and maturing disciples of Jesus Christ," we must remember we do so as the Christ Body, "making love our aim."

My heart was stirred by Henri J.M. Nouwen in his book <u>A Spirituality of Fundraising:</u>

"What is the kingdom? Jesus is clear that if we make the kingdom our first priority, "all these other things will be given to you as well" (Matt. 6:33). The kingdom is where God provides for all that we need. It is the realm of sufficiency where we are no longer pulled here and there by anxiety about having enough. "So, do not worry about tomorrow: tomorrow will take care of itself" (Matt. 6:34). Jesus also compares the kingdom to a mustard seed, "which, at the time of its sowing, is the smallest of all seeds on earth. Yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade" (Mk. 4:31-32). Even a seemingly small act of generosity can grow into something far beyond what we could ever ask or imagine – the creation of a community of love in this world, and beyond this world, because wherever love grows, it is stronger than death (1 Cor. 13:8). So, when we give ourselves to planting and nurturing love here on earth, our efforts will reach out beyond our own chronological existence. Indeed, if we raise funds for the creation of a community of love, we are helping God build the kingdom. We are doing exactly what we are supposed to do as Christians. Paul is clear about this: 'Make love your aim' (1 Cor. 14:1)."

When followers obedient to Christ make love their aim, hearts **experience** love and then **express** love and the world will be transformed, maybe not as fast as we would like, but God will see to ultimate transformation.

In the coming months, Hudson UMC will hear an invitation to express love through our commitment to financially support the mission and ministry God is challenging us to offer towards the building of the Kingdom. I am committing to pray, **"Lord of Love, I long to live faithfully and enlarge your kingdom. Trusting in your abundance, reveal to me how to <u>express</u> your love through my gift. Amen."**

I invite you to commit to praying this or a prayer of your making, as Hudson UMC makes love our aim.

Youth Basement Flooded by August 8 Rainstorm


Friday morning of the 9th revealed 1.5" of sewer water had flooded the Youth basement and storage rooms. Thankfully, 10 volunteers showed up to clean up and move furniture, stored equipment, material and tools. The Trustees secured the Cut and Dry restoration company to begin that day with additional water removal, removal of all soiled carpeting and mold prevention treatment at a cost of \$12,698. (Impacted by the water with some damage and moved from the carpeting were ASP tools, equipment, stored files, Christmas decorations, and Scout and Youth room furniture.) Along with all carpeting, the much-loved huge bean bag chairs had to be tossed out. The Trustees are now considering various waterproof floor coverings after restoration. This restoration expense has a major impact on the Care and Repair fund after lighting damage repairs, electrical surge and lightning protection expenses, walk repair and other expenses. The balance of the Care and Repair Fund will be left substantially depleted. Your continued support is certainly needed. We thank you!

Fall Sunday School Begins September 22nd

Our summer Sunday school unit, *Power of Prayer*, wraps up on August 25th, as we complete our study of different ways to pray, including the way Jesus taught his disciples to pray.



The Sunday school kids learned that when we talk and listen to God, we are setting our hearts on something in a way that shapes our life and leads us to action. Prayer helps us to align our hearts with God's heart.

When talking about the Lord's Prayer, we said that when Jesus' disciples asked him to teach them how to pray, it was as if they were asking Jesus, "What should we set our hearts on?" We imagined Jesus choosing his

words carefully in response, knowing that he was teaching them (and all of his followers to come) a pattern for a way of thinking and living that would set them in line with God's will for the world.

We think about Bible stories in the same way. They survived and are re-told because they hold significant meaning, teaching us what we need to know about God's nature and God's will.

As the school year begins, we will continue to teach our kids the important stories and core concepts of our faith. For the **Preschool through Grade 5** age group, last year's new *WonderInk* curriculum proved to be effective, fun, and meaningful. We will continue using it with new stories this year, following the church calendar: Old Testament stories up to Advent, stories of Jesus' birth, life, death and resurrection through Lent, and early church history through May.

The youth class, **Grades 6 through 12** will turn from last year's over-arching story of the Bible to a study of Christian core beliefs as they are illustrated through Scripture. This study will be guided by a new curriculum, *Activate: The Building Blocks of Faith*. Among the 17 foundational elements of faith that we will cover are the Trinity, God's Glory, Salvation, Grace, God's Mission, Discipleship, The Church, God's Presence, and more.
