

"See, I am doing a new thing!
Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness
and streams in the wasteland." Isaiah 43:19 NIV

God is still "doing a new thing – in the world, in and through UMC, in and through Hudson UMC. Some do not deny this "new thing" God is doing, but question, <u>what</u> is God doing and <u>when</u> will God reveal the "new thing?"

Throughout my ministry, I have experienced God's "new thing." God is doing a new thing in me, in individuals in congregations I served and in entire congregations. I can also look back and identify small steps that were taken before the "new thing" was made evident.

I have mentioned in recent messages that I sense God is about to make clear how God desires to call Hudson UMC to be the "new thing" Isaiah foretold. I have sensed this for some time, last summer in fact. It was then that as goals were formulated I sensed small steps needed to be in place. What follows are some of the small steps, your leadership developed as goals for 2025. It is healthy to share the following goals so as to lessen any resistance to what we at Hudson UMC are doing to prepare for Gods' "new thing."

Following the format, the leadership of East Ohio Conference provided to each local church, these short-term and long-term goals were approved by Church Council and then by Charge Conference on Saturday. November 2, 2024.

Short term Goal #1 (within 1 year)

Build the "Discipleship Team" Identifying areas of ministry enables creation of teams where members can engage their gifts and passions. Once areas are identified and defined, members will be invited to engage.

(Discipleship Pathway Team's purpose is to create and communicate the discipleship pathway (steps/opportunities for growth) – implementing the culture shift.)

Short term Goal #2 (within 1 year)

Implementation of Simplified Accountable Structure (SAS)

Maturing disciples must be intentional. The SAS model lessens the hurdles to release members to be in ministry. (SAS – some may be more familiar with this structure than others. Members of Church Council have led presentations to offer definition and how the function of Church Council will fold into the SAS model. Our DSs have given Hudson UMC approval to transition into SAS. This is an important step to the "new thing. Progress will be shared in the coming months.)

Long term Goal #1 (achieved in 5 years)

Populating (identifying members to serve on teams) the ministry teams identified in Short Term Goal #1.

Staff/Leaders will collaborate with one another to identify members who have passion/gifts for ministries essential to living in to the mission. Engage in conversations to communicate with the specific ministry we are seeking to fill.

Identifying the areas of ministry enables creation of teams where members can engage their gifts and passions. It is understood we cannot do everything and run in many directions. Once areas are identified and defined, members will be invited to engage.

Long term Goal #2 (achieved in 5 years)

- A. **100% of membership to serve-** in Hudson UMC and/or beyond our walls...to the ends of the earth. (*note: Encourage service as an important means of maturing as a disciple of Christ.*)
- B. Increase the % of members engaged in small groups (note: upon the conclusion of 2024 Elizabeth calculated the % in 2024. FYI 30% of those who attended worship from September through May participated in a Church School class. 20% of those attending worship in June-August participated in a Church School class. With this data, leaders will set a % to achieve in 2025.)

What is shared is <u>not</u> the "new thing." I do believe the next steps noted above will open our hearts to perceive the "new thing" God is calling Hudson UMC to nurture.

What's New?

In this month's article, Rev. Bruce referenced this Scripture passage from Isaiah:

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." Isaiah 43:19 NIV

I love this passage because whenever we read it, it's always true. God is dynamic and *always* doing a new thing. Whatever it may be, we can surely know that it is in the direction away from wilderness and wasteland. A new way is always coming – in us, through us, and around us!

As we begin a new year at Hudson UMC, I encourage each of us to ask what new thing God may be doing in us as individuals along a faith journey and also as a church charged with creating an environment that nurtures faith. What "new" are we being called toward?

Over the past year, we have spoken about our mission to make disciples and our strategy for accomplishing this mission. We have called it the Pathway to Discipleship. I perceive that we're on the right track with this pathway first, because as we have engaged in this pursuit, the way has become more and more clear and second, precisely because it's new.

The change, however, is not so much in what we're doing as it is in the mindset that supports it.

How is it different?

Hudson UMC is moving away from using people to fill its programs and toward using the resources of the church to invest in the spiritual formation of its people. Rather than using people to build the church, we will use the church to build people. We are positioning ourselves as guides who provide opportunities for growth and who develop and deploy people in their own ministries for which they are gifted and feel called. The result of this small shift in thinking, will be a church active in unique ministries that particularly reflect the gifts and passions of its people.

This "way" requires an individual mindset shift as well. Our intent in this new way of doing church is for each member to move away from volunteering to fill a need to intentionally pursuing their own faith journey and actively asking themselves where and how they are being called. From the options available, they may choose their own next step in their journey, be it a class, a small group, or a service opportunity. If an opportunity is not available, then they will be enabled to create one. The Discipleship Pathway is one marked by intention, movement, and individual choice.


For everyone at all points, taking time for discernment will be necessary and important, lest we forget who is ultimately making our way.

HUMC Missions Committee Thanks You for Your Generous Giving

The HUMC church family is filled with generous givers which was made evident by the many donations made by our church to organizations throughout 2024. Here is a recap of 2024 donations from you and the important missions you supported through your generous giving:

Alternative Easter Giving (Chicks & Sheep)

Several of you volunteered to help once a month at the "Mountain of Food" distribution at OPEN-M. Thanks to Linda Brown for coordinating this vital mission in Akron.

Feed My Sheep

\$1,700 received in donations with \$775 used to meet the ongoing toilet paper needs of this organization. The balance will be used to continue supplying the weekly toilet paper needs for FMS throughout 2025. In addition to supplying TP, many of you donated items that were distributed by members of this church that volunteer for the monthly distribution. Thanks to Nancy Kralik for coordinating this important mission work.

Habitat for Humanity

\$2,667 received in donations for a Habitat House being built in Akron. HUMC also of Summit County provided labor crews to work on the Habitat house three weekends this past summer. Hat's off to


