
### "A JOURNEY THROUGH LENT"

Hudson UMC made a journey to Bethlehem a few months ago. As Disciples of Christ, we now embark on another journey – "A Journey Through Lent." Throughout the 40 days of Lent, we reflect on our need to restore our relationship with God on Ash Wednesday. Each Sunday during Lent we will take steps toward Jerusalem and the Cross. This is not the end of the journey but a life-altering experience that is completed at the tomb...an empty tomb.

Together we encounter possibly the question of a lifetime, "Does Easter Really Matter?"

### March 5 - Ash Wednesday - Joel 2:12-17 "Return to Your God" 7:00 pm

The Ash Wednesday service is one of the most important occasions in the church year. It helps us prepare our hearts for the season of Lent. What unfolds during Lent is the restoration of our relationship with God.



### March 9 – Genesis 9:8-17 "God's Love Will Never Fail"

When God created us, God did a most shocking thing. God gave us the freedom to decide our own destiny. There are implications for this condition. Can you imagine God taking such a risk? God surely knows we might give into our dark sides. Even so, God's love will never fail.

### March 16 – Mark 8:31-38 "Giving Our All"

What does it mean to deny yourself and take up the cross? Denying ourselves and taking up a cross is a choice we make—not something that is forced upon us. It has to do with discipline and hard work. When Christ talked about his followers denying themselves and taking up the cross, he was talking about people who are willing to make more than a token sacrifice.

## March 23 – John 2:13-22 "Is it Acceptable to Get Angry, it Depends"

Is there some evil in the world that a voice within you keeps saying, "Somebody ought to do something about that?" Some things should

make us angry – when the weak are trampled, when children are abused, when the poor are taken advantage of, and the homeless are neglected. Sometimes the greatest sin we can commit is not getting angry over the right things.

### March 30 – Ephesians 2:1-10 "You Are God's Handiwork...Say No More!"

We are God's handiwork because of what God has done for us in Jesus Christ. New life begins when we understand that we are God's handiwork – God's work or art – and that God has a plan for our life. When that happens, we will be on the path to being all God intends for us to be.

### April 6 - Jeremiah 31:31-34 "If Nothing Changes, Nothing Changes"

Jesus was constantly calling people to engage God through a relationship rather than through religious rituals. He said, essentially, to know me is to know God — to follow me is to follow a new path, and to be in God's presence, to experience God's grace is the way to real change.

### April 13 - Palm Sunday Mark 11:1-10 "Donkey Sunday"


Intelligent, cooperative, noble. That's the character of the heroic donkey. And also, the qualities of Christians who want to carry Jesus forward in what they think, do, and say.

### April 17 – Maundy Thursday John 13:1-15 "Do We Understand...Yet" 7 pm

When we come to the table this night, let us come in the spirit of humility. Let us reflect our understanding of what Christ has done for us.

### April 20 - Easter "Does Easter Really Matter?"

Reaffirming our faith in the resurrection is part of why many of us are here today. We need to be reminded of the power of life over death, of hope over despair, of love over hate, and there is only one place on earth that can be found. That is by peering into an empty tomb of the man from Galilee.

### What's Your S.H.A.P.E.?

A couple of years ago, I shared the two images below with a group of Hudson UMC women as I was relating the attempts of a younger me to find a meaningful ministry to pursue.



I knew I liked to cook, so I first tried volunteering to prepare and package meals for other *Meals on Wheels* volunteers to deliver. I did the task, but there was no joy in it for me. It exhausted me, and I soon began to dread those meal prep sessions. As I watched the other dedicated volunteers doing this important work, I wondered if perhaps, unlike them, I was just not a caring enough person.

Fast forward to when my kids began to participate in my church's Vacation Bible School program. I decided to volunteer as a teacher, and in contrast to my previous

experience, I found myself energized by this work. I discovered that I loved interacting with the kids. I loved the creative and effective ways I was given to teach them their lessons, and it excited me to think about new ways to make an impact in the classroom. A belief began to grow in me that *this* was how I could make a difference. More than that, this was how I was *made* to make a difference.



This is the way ministry ought to be - not a chore, but a privilege.

In his forward to Erik Rees's book S.H.A.P.E.: Finding and Fulfilling Your Unique Purpose for Life, Pastor Rick Warren writes, "God has given every creature he made a special area of expertise to fulfill its purpose...Each has a particular role to play based on the way they were shaped by God."
