UMC Bishops Issue "Seek Peace and Pursue It!" Statement

Every day, we are besieged with acts of violence across the globe. From Gaza to Goma to Orem to Evergreen. We grieve with families, communities and nations as they bear the weight of the pain and grief that violence leaves in its wake. The assassination of Charlie Kirk reminds us of the urgent need to address the growing threat of political violence.

We unequivocally condemn this act of violence and all violence. Violence dehumanizes victims and perpetrators. We call upon all people to reject the divisive rhetoric that fractures community. The most recent school shooting in Colorado summons us again to work to make schools safe places, to equip children to manage difference and disagreement nonviolently and to reduce the easy access to guns.

We are guided by the prophetic vision of Isaiah, who wrote, "They will beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Nation will not take up sword against nation, nor will they train for war anymore" (Isaiah 2:4). This vision of a world where weapons are transformed into instruments of peace and prosperity is a powerful reminder of our calling to be active peacemakers.

As United Methodists gather for worship over the next several days, we call you to prayer and meaningful action against violence as a means to dispute settlement. We urge United Methodists to actively promote a culture of understanding, respect, and nonviolent conflict resolution. We encourage all United Methodists to work for public policies that foster community and reduce violence locally and globally.

This statement was read in the worship service on September 21, 2025.

Visitor vs. Guest AND Friendly vs. Welcoming

One of the significant aspects of growing as a disciple involves learning and living in community with others. Helping to create this community at Hudson UMC involves the work of two active ministry teams: Hospitality and Fellowship. Their focus is on welcoming strangers and building relationships here at Hudson UMC.

The Hospitality Ministry Team has devoted themselves to improving the first experiences of newcomers to Hudson UMC. These newcomers are the seekers, who have consciously made the life-changing decision to grow in their faith.

Early in their discussions, The Hospitality Ministry Team contrasted the difference between a visitor and a guest. A visitor is someone who has dropped in and may not be expected. Therefore, there are no thoughts, plans, or actions taken to make them feel especially valued and welcomed.

A guest, on the other hand is invited and expected. Consideration has been taken to anticipate their needs, questions, and comfort. They are received with welcome hospitality and desired to return, similar to the way we would welcome a guest into our own home.

The goal of the Hospitality Ministry Team is to help create an environment where newcomers to Hudson UMC feel like welcome guests rather than unanticipated visitors. You may have already noticed some of the signs of this work. But this kind of welcome also exists on another level and involves not just a small ministry team, but everyone.

Consider something that Hudson UMC's own Amy Lunn recently posted on her Facebook page. It was her recollection of a conversation that took place during a Bible study at another local church. With her permission, I share it with you here:

I'm thinking this morning about what someone told me is the difference between a "friendly" church and a "welcoming" church. If you attend a "friendly" church," you will be greeted, and people will smile and make you feel welcome to worship with them. If you attend a "welcoming" church, people will ask if they may sit beside you, and they will personally invite you to attend Bible study classes, women's or men's groups, or some fellowship event the church is planning. After a while, you may even be invited to become a member of that church. People will begin to care for you, pray for you when you are ill, and grieve with you, not just send a card, when you've suffered a loss. I wonder what I can do to assure that the church I attend is not just a "friendly" church.

Many have expressed that a posture of welcome, hospitality, love, and community is one of our church's gifts. I would agree. We are in a God-given position to work together to assure that the seekers who are led to worship with us on a Sunday morning, experience God's invitation to continue on their journey. And may we all be reminded...this is a journey intended not to fill our own kingdom but to join in building God's.

Introducing a new adult Sunday school class: The Bible Project.


炒 BIBLE PROJECT


