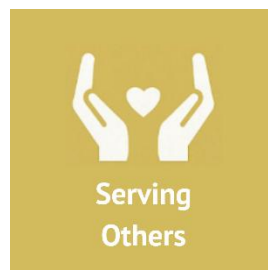
Paul Brown – Lay Leader (which includes him on the committees noted above.)

Happy Anniversary!

This January 20, 2026 marks the two-year anniversary for a group of Hudson UMC members who committed to reading the entire Bible over the course of two years. This group participated in the *Bible Study Together* plan that combined readings from both the Old and New Testaments grouped to provide context, lay out a clear timeline, and tell a chronological history by cross-referencing Bible passages together. The readings were further enriched through videos that illustrated various themes encountered within the readings.

Whether members of this group are celebrating their giant accomplishment with their final readings this month or are still “catching up” (I’m in that group!), I know that taking part in this exercise has been both a rewarding and enlightening faith experience.

I am drawn to share insights of my own from years ago when I first accepted this awesome challenge within a Bethel Bible Class taught by my friend Peggie Jo, at a previous church. My hope is that these words will help to inspire others to join a **new Hudson UMC Bible Study Together reading group beginning on February 1, 2026.**

When we were asked on our first day of Bethel why we were making this commitment to read and study the Bible, I wasn’t sure of my answer, only that I’d always wanted to. Now, nineteen months later, as Peggie Jo predicted, I have a much deeper understanding of God’s message to us, but many more questions. And I am sure of only one thing: I need to read it again.

But it seems to me that Bethel (and all) Bible students are seeking something that all humanity has sought, and that is a meaning to life and an answer to those questions with which we struggle: "Why are we here?" "Why do we suffer?" "Is there an order to life?" "Can we trust in a higher power at work in our lives?" "What is this longing in our hearts?" And, "Am I significant?"

The Bible is evidence of this struggle, and also God's response. The Bible story is our story. It chronicles our own journey of faith, a path that leads from death to life, many times over.

When does this death occur? It happens whenever we choose to trust only in what we can see and create alone, when we forget that we are a child of God and become a child of the world. This is our forbidden fruit, our golden calf, and our distant country.

The good news is that God is actively leading us back. God has chosen a path for us that will lead us out of the darkness of spiritual death and into the light. Through the stories of Creation, Noah, Abraham, Joseph, Moses, and many others, God teaches us what we need to know about his nature and about ours.

We learn that there is a way to be saved if we put our faith and trust in him. We are called to put our life in God's hands and that even when evil seems to prevail, we learn that God can work for ultimate good. At times, God's voice speaks directly to us: "I am with you." "I am strong." "I am in control." "Follow me." "Depend on me." "I will provide for you." "I will help you overcome." "I will work extraordinary deeds through you." "Serve only me."

When we forget, we suffer consequences, but the message remains the same. God is patient with us, and we begin again the cycle of restoration: New life breathed into dry bones.

*Experiencing this restoration gives us hope and helps us to remember that we are a spirit first, and a child of God, and so we have grace. A child of the world would have died in the flood or drowned in the Red Sea, but because we are **God's** children, God made a provision. In a world filled with temptation and free will, there is also mercy, forgiveness, and second chances. How could we survive otherwise?*

This provision came in the form of a man on a cross, who by his example taught us to forgive, to turn our judgment inward, and love our enemies. He demonstrated the power of God to transform us, to cleanse us, to make the weak strong and to enable the blind. Through our faith and trust, we are given a new life with a choice. Will we choose to follow our true intended nature and live this life in fellowship with God? Will we use our gifts in servanthood and love? In our response lies our salvation.

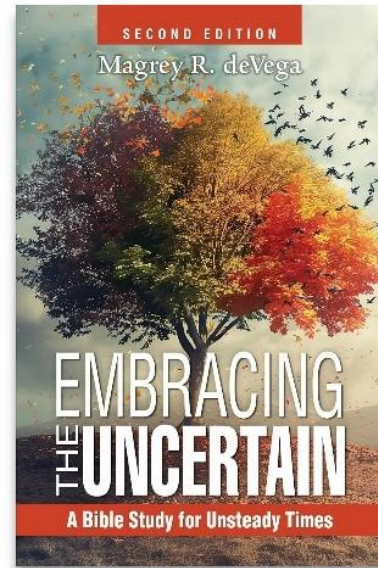
Upcoming Adult Sunday School Studies:

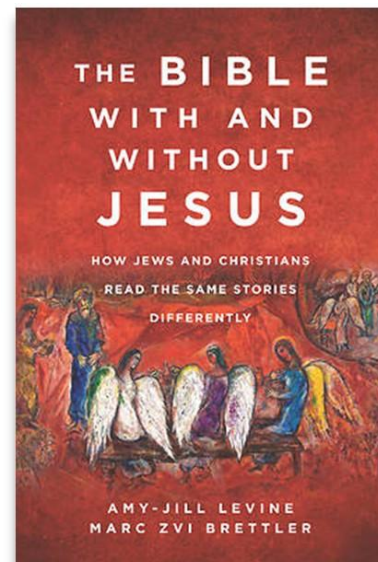

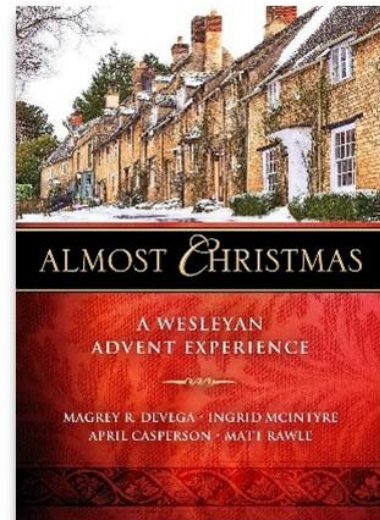

January 4 – January 11

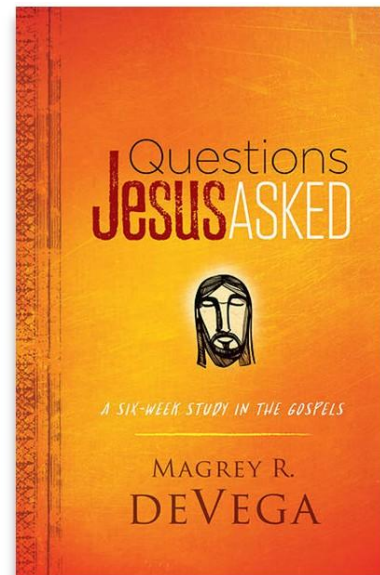

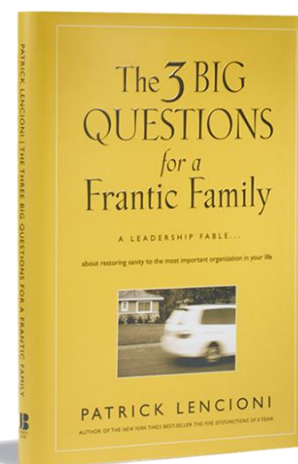
Frantic Family Workshop
