

The Chosen S5, E1: “Entry”

Main Events

- *Jesus finishes his Upper Room discourse and begins his high priestly prayer¹; the Last Supper closes with a hymn².*
- Jesus has his (Palm Sunday) triumphal entry into Jerusalem³.
- After Jesus tells a crowd in the Temple court that his hour has come and asks God to glorify his name, a voice from heaven responds in a thunderclap⁴.
- At night, observing the chaos in the Temple court has a vision of Jerusalem’s destruction⁵.



Other Highlights

- Roman Atticus warns Pilate that Jesus may be a problem. After Pilate gives Caiaphas a veiled threat, Caiaphas promises to prevent riots and to deliver high revenue.
- Pharisee Yussif disguises himself so that he can follow Jesus and listen to his teaching.
- Leading a group of angry men, Ramah’s father Kafni tells the “Watcher” that Jesus is a dangerous false prophet; the “Watcher” warns Kafni that Jesus has many supporters.
- Wandering the city at night, Jesus is recognized at a betrothal. He blesses the coming union and encourages everyone to pursue heavenly desires and pure minds.
- Jesus wakes Zebedee to tell him to take the women in their party out of the city the next morning. Jesus then uses his father’s bridle to fashion a flail for a whip.

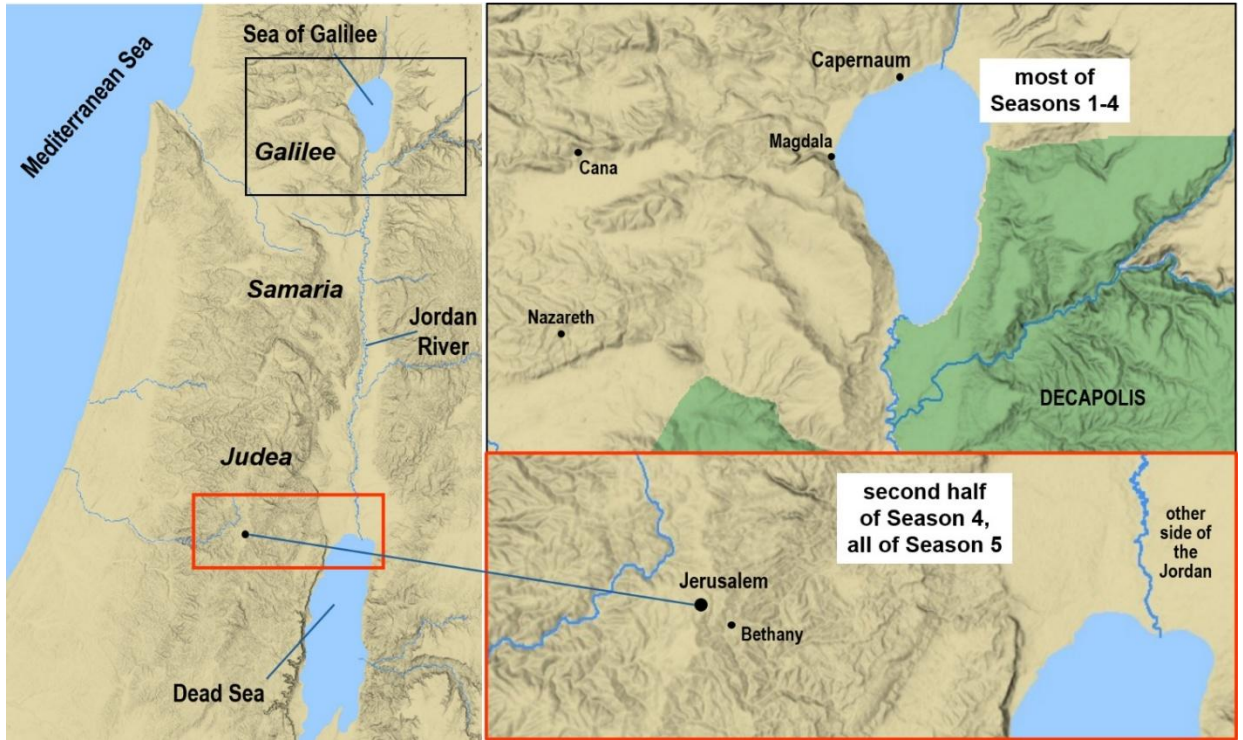

Jerusalem

By 34 BC, under King Herod's rule, ancient Jerusalem went through major redevelopment, crowned with the rebuilding of the Second Temple and a bigger Temple Mount. In 66 AD, the Great Jewish Revolt challenged Roman rule over Jerusalem, resulting in the destruction of the temple and the fall of Jerusalem by 70 AD.
